How to make it happen:

- 1. Lay the outdoor mat in the garden.
- 2. Gather the children on the mat and play the song, "Mr. Sun, Sun, Mister Golden Sun!".
- 3. Change the lyrics to:
 - Walk, walk, walk around the mat

- Lie, lie, lie down on the mat
- Sit, sit, sit down on the mat
- 4. Sing the song and get the children to do the actions of the new lyrics.
- 5. Allow each child to choose one rock.
- 6. Say, "These are beautiful rocks. How does it feel like?" (to recap activity words from earlier activity: "rough" and "smooth").
- 7. Educarer drops one rock in a plastic container and shakes the container.
- 8. Say, "My (yellow / red / blue) rock is dancing in the container. It makes some sounds. Let's make our rocks dance in the container."
- 9. Encourage the children to drop their rocks in the plastic container. Seal the container with a lid.
- 10. Say, "Can you drop the rock in the container? That is loud!"
- 11. Say: "How can we make our rocks dance?" Encourage the children to make the rocks "dance" in the container, and get children to listen to the loud sound made by the "dancing" rocks in the container.
- 12. With the same song, change the lyrics to: "Dance, dance, dance to the song."
- 13. Educarer models dance steps and encourages the children to shake their rocks.
- 14. Repeat the steps with the leaves and get children to listen to the soft sound made by the "dancing" leaves in the container.
- 15. Highlight the "loud" and "soft" sounds made by the rocks and leaves, respectively, to the children.
