 What you will need: Plastic eggs 	Benefit - Risk Assessment: Benefit: • Children will enjoy finding objects in nature. They will start to observe the things around them more intentionally.
	 <u>Risk</u>: Wandering too far out of sight Insect bites Scratches from sharp branches on plants <u>Management</u>: Ensure children know the boundaries of the space they can walk within. Check area first to identify presence of ant nests etc.

How to make it happen:

- 1. Give each child a plastic egg. Let them roam around the garden for things that can be put in the plastic egg. Have them shake it to discover whether it makes a sound.
- 2. Have the children guess what is in their friend's egg.
- 3. Ask questions to have them predict the object.
 - a. "Do you think it's hard or soft?
 - b. "Do you think its heavy or light?"
- 4. Have them match the eggs as they think if they contain similar objects.
- 5. Open the eggs up and show its contents. Use descriptive language to describe the contents and the sound it makes.
