## Risk:

- Insects bites

## Management:

- Scan the venue to ensure it is free from potential hazards such as sharp objects, pot holes, broken tiles or insects
- Set limits/boundary for children to explore
- Ensure teachers have sight of the children at all times

## How to make it happen:

- 1. Take children out for a walk and ask children to describe a tree of their choice during the walk
- 2. Ask questions such as: "How long do you think the trees have been here? What kind of trees are they? Do you think trees are important? Why?
- 3. Invite children to dress the tree up for a particular occasion such as Chinese New Year, Christmas or Hari Raya Puasa, etc.
- 4. Once the tree is dressed, use it as a focal point in the setting to visit and talk about the tree and its decorations, for telling stories under the shade.
