Environment: Outdoor multipurpose hall/void deck/grass patch/field	Estimated time: 30 minutes
Children's prior experiences: Children are familiar with the outdoor space which they have been visiting frequently. Children are able to roll things to a target.	Suitable for: 18 to 24 months old
 What children will experience: Children will learn to listen to and follow simple instructions. Children will develop their hand-eye coordination, fine and gross motor skills and judgment of distance. 	 EYDF Pillars: The Developing Child The Intentional Programme The Professional Educarer
What you will need: a tray of colourful small and big soft spongy balls/beanbags/plastic balls a cardboard house/any box/bucket/basket Tape/chalk (nontoxic)	Benefit - Risk Assessment: Benefit: Children become more motivated and self-directed in playing in the open outdoor space. Risk: Children may bump into each other in their excitement with throwing balls into the box. Management: Ensure ample space between each cardboard house/box/bucket/basket and assign adequate number of adults to supervise the children. Brief children on the activity. Apply insect-repellent. Bring along first-aid kit.

How to make it happen:

- 1. Inform the children the goal is to get the balls inside a cardboard house/box/bucket/basket.
- 2. Place a tape/draw a line on the floor with chalk/tape and make each child stand behind it.
- 3. Set the cardboard house/any box about 3 feet away.
- 4. Ask the children to throw the smaller plastic/spongy balls into the cardboard house/box/bucket/basket.
- 5. Let the children play and practise a few rounds.

Extension of activity:

1. Repeat the activity regularly, and once the children are able to throw the balls into the cardboard house/box/bucket/basket, increase the distance between him/her and the cardboard house/box/bucket/basket and use other balls.
