- Bristles on the brushes to be checked
- No cracks on trays and buckets
- Trip hazards in area
- Slippery floor

Management:

- Teacher to check environment for trip hazards and materials for sharp edges or cracks.
- Toddlers to wear non-slip boots.

How to make it happen:

- Place several buckets or trays of water and different types of paintbrushes and rollers on the ground.
- Ensure there is sufficient space for all children to use the brushes on surfaces in the area.
- Show the toddlers how to dip the brushes into the water and lift it up and place it on the concrete floor or walls to paint.
- Allow toddlers time to explore working with both the brushes /rollers and water.

Teaching strategies:

- Model use of rollers
- Observe how the infants handle the brushes and rollers.
- Draw children's attention to the water drying where they had previously painted

Point to note:

Ensure that sufficient materials are provided for parallel play during this stage of development as children this age find sharing challenging.

Possible song (though not necessary) to sing while painting with water:

This is the way..... (to the tune of Here we go round the Mulberry Bush)
